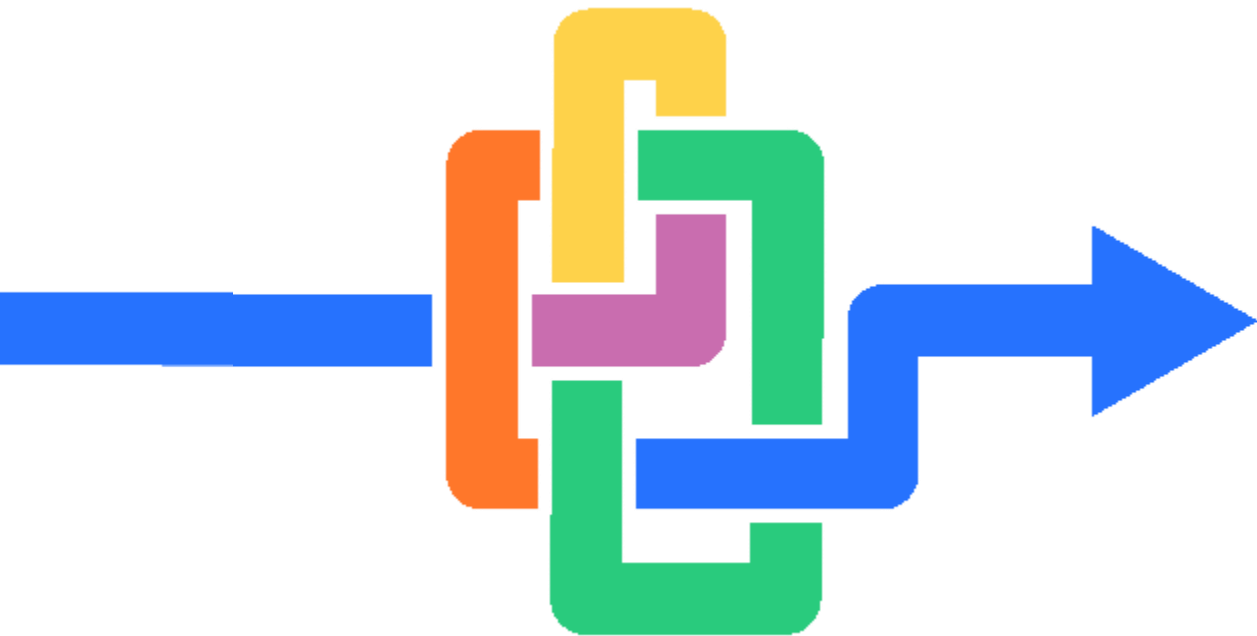

What is ICAP?

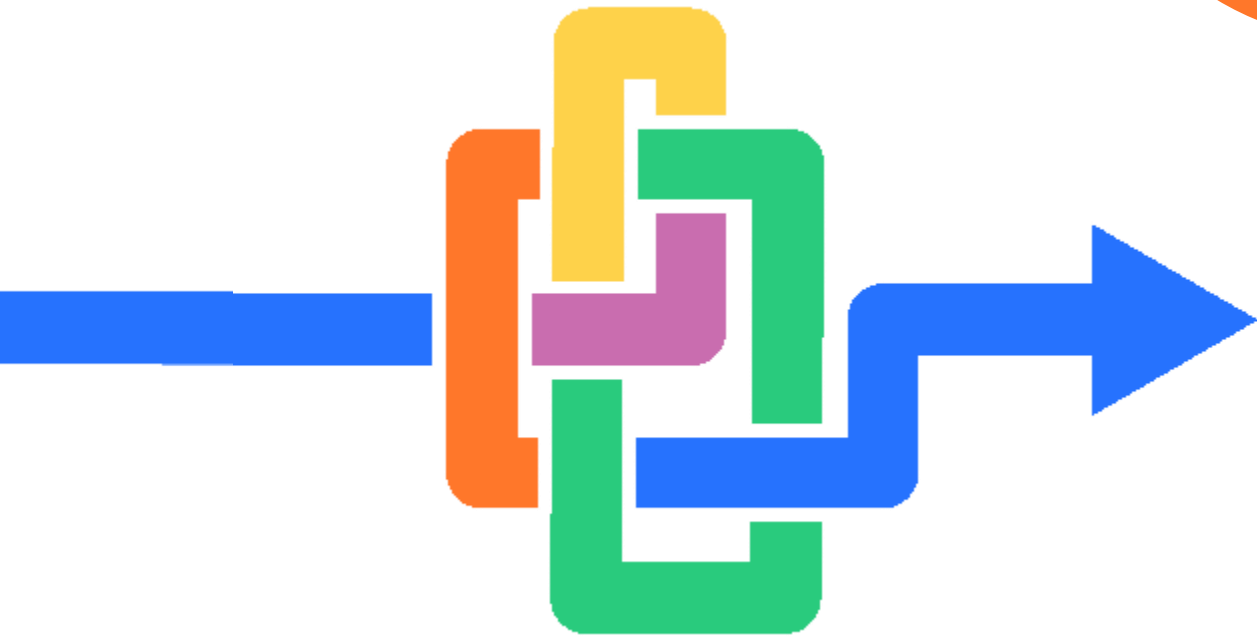
Individual Career Academic Planning is a multi-year process that intentionally guides students as they explore career, academic, and postsecondary opportunities.



Want to try out college before leaving high school? Consider signing up for concurrent enrollment. If you are in 11th or 12th grade and have made good grades throughout school or scored well on the ACT or SAT, you might consider taking credit-earning college courses while still in high school. You can enroll in college courses if you meet one of the admission requirements listed on the provided tables and other conditions listed below.

High school seniors who meet the eligibility requirements are entitled to receive tuition waivers for up to 18 credit hours and high school juniors can receive tuition waivers up to 9 credit hours, subject to available funding.

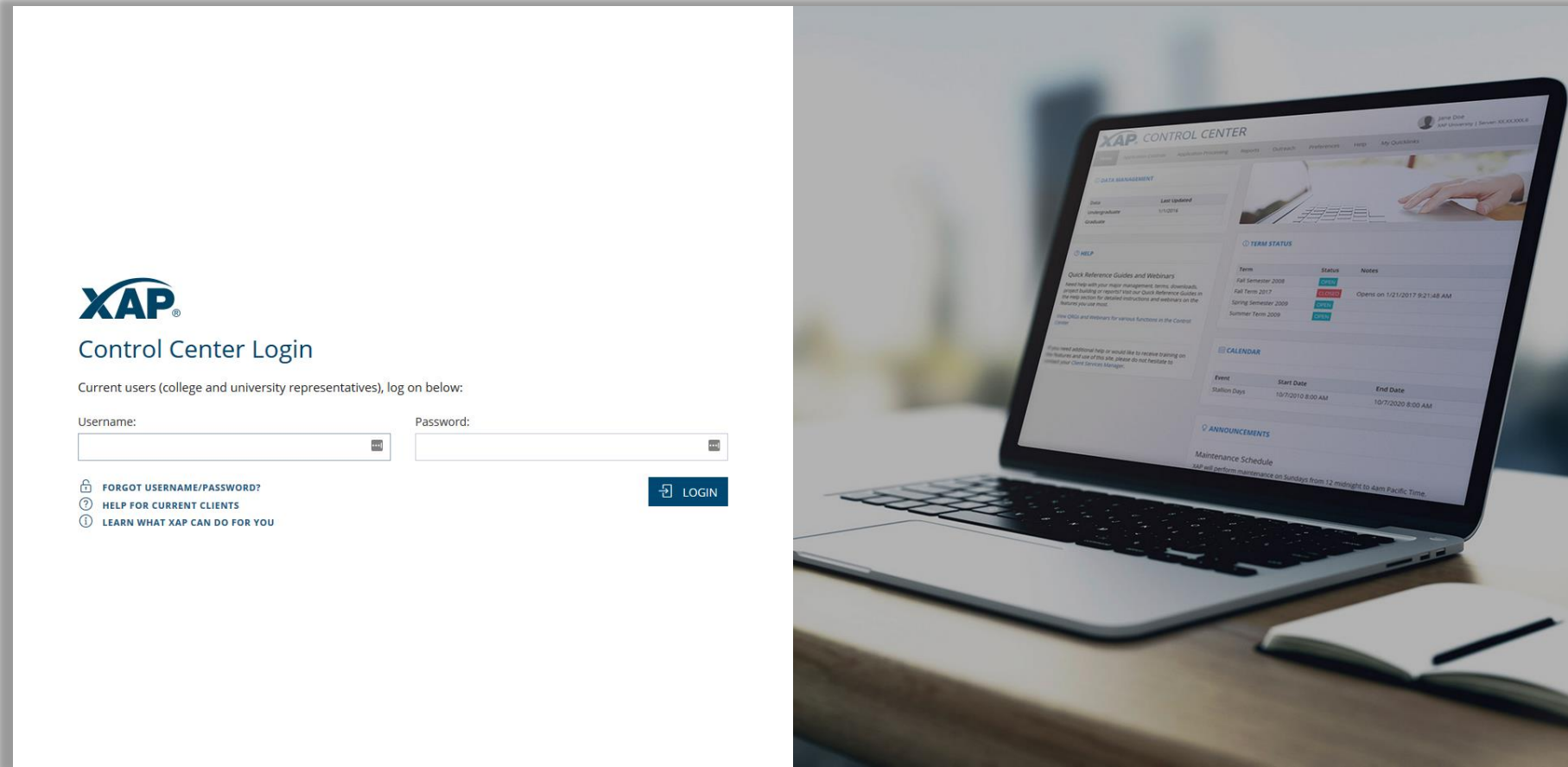

2. Apply for Financial Aid

How do I apply for financial aid?

You should complete the [Free Application for Federal Student Aid \(FAFSA\)](#) as soon as it becomes available in your senior year of high school and each year you are in college. By completing this application, you have applied for most federal and state financial aid.

1. Gather materials
2. Create an FSA ID
3. Fill it out
4. Sign & submit
5. Follow up



To complete the FAFSA you will need an [FSA ID \(Federal Student Aid\)](#), a username and password that allows you to log in to some Department of Education websites as well as access and electronically sign your FAFSA. The first time you submit the FAFSA, you'll need to create your FSA ID and allow 2-3 days for the login credentials to be verified. After your FSA ID is approved, you'll be able to submit your FAFSA.

Educational benefits and scholarships are available to those who serve in the U.S. Armed Forces. Some scholarships pay full tuition and all instructional fees, and may include a living allowance. Loan repayment is also available to Army service personnel. 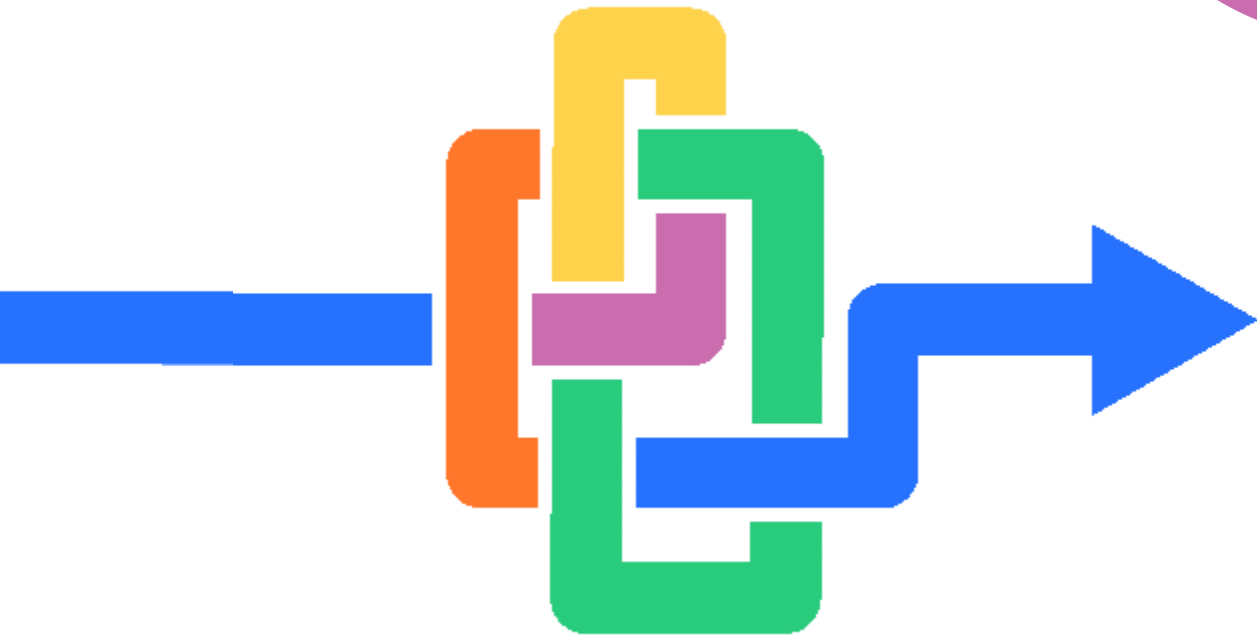

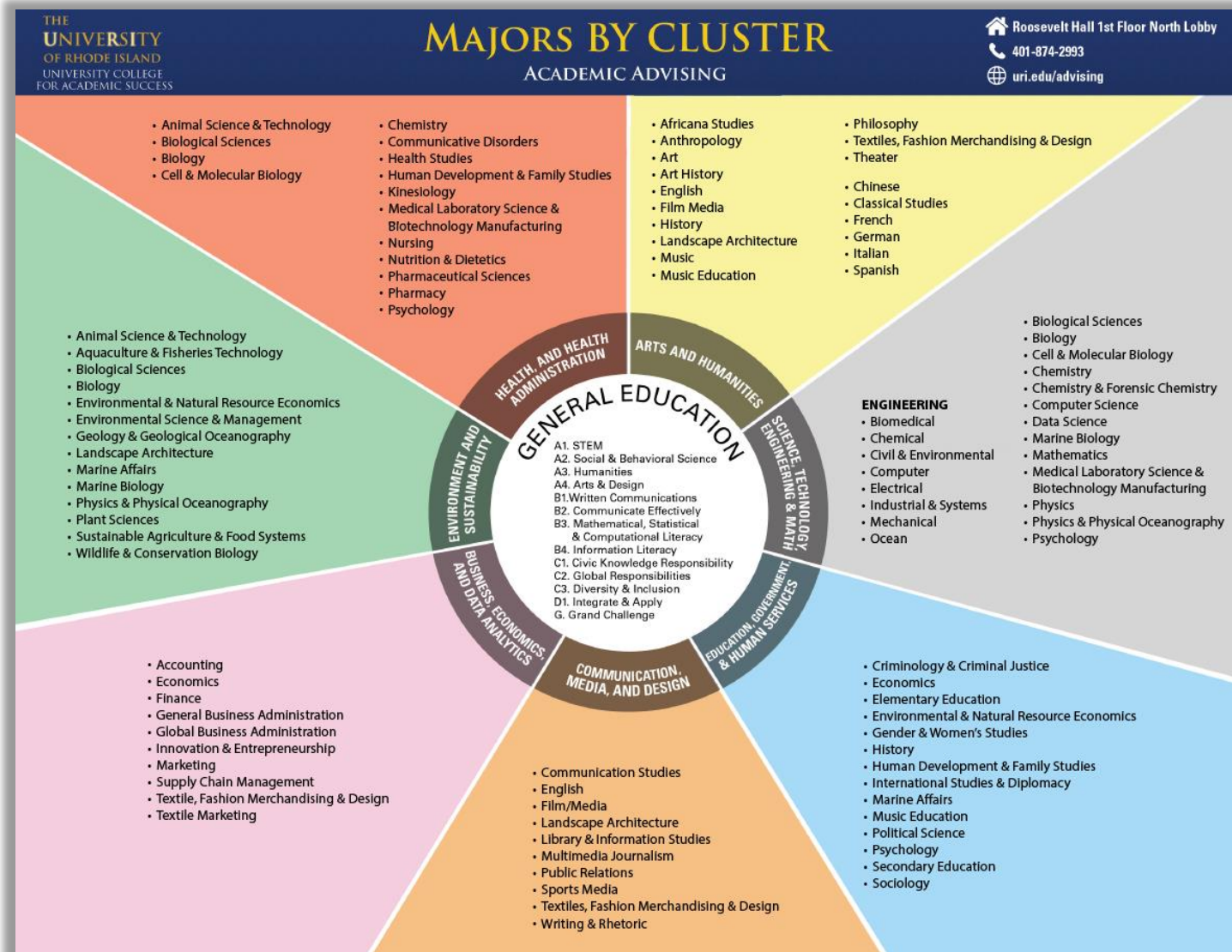

- Relationships should go beyond your recruitment team

Common Barriers

- Venues for large student-centered events

Partner & Support

- Reach out to individual schools for potential recruiting efforts
- Develop partnerships with your alumni network
- Offer discounted (or free) space to host high school events in return for the opportunity to promote your institution

Jump Start Conversations

- ICAP is a jumping-off point to begin the conversation about students' long-term goals.
- Oklahoma students are now coming to college more ready than ever to have conversations about where they see themselves after graduation.

Recruitment

- Using OKcollegestart to connect users directly to their institutions of interest
- Intentional campus visits: both campus tours and high school visits

- Intentionally plan internships
- Students are already coming in with experience
